

Oban's Draft Local Energy Plan (LEP) What's it all about?

This Local Energy Plan enables the local community to look at its existing and future energy needs in terms of power, heat and transport and sets out where it sees priorities for action. It then identifies opportunities that could help to address these priorities and when implemented could see benefits for both individuals and the community of Oban well into the future. In developing this LEP, a number of engagement activities have been carried out in order to offer all members of the community a chance to share their opinion, which helped to shape the plan moving forward.

These activities identified three main priorities that individuals want to see tackled by Oban's Local Energy Plan:

- Cheaper energy bills
- Warmer homes that are better insulated
- Increased local energy generation

In terms of any proposed energy projects, individuals wanted those projects to be prioritised in order to deliver benefits relating to:

- Lower fuel poverty
- Reduction in electricity prices
- Increased local energy generation



Action to address Local Priorities

The Draft Local Energy Plan reviews local options and opportunities that seek to find a balance between the priorities outlined by the community and the technical challenges of each option. The plan outlines a number of proposed action points some of which are detailed below.

Explore the potential for individuals to access

of local Electric vehicles and support grants/loans to purchase their own

Increased local support to householders to access

funding for insulation and heating upgrades

Traffic management to reduce flow through town
Improving efficiency of local road networks and support
safer active travel on foot and bike

Develop local renewable energy opportunities

Encourage and support the uptake of renewable systems at home e.g. solar PV and seek to set standards for new build developments

Why is Oban's Local Energy Plan important?

- The plan enables you to define priorities in your community
- The more you know about energy in your community the more you can make changes and benefit
- The way energy is generated and distributed in Scotland is changing and this plan gives Oban a head start in benefiting from these changes
